The Word

Reading for March 29, 2020

John 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45

Adults:

The death from which we are called is healing from those things which bind us and hold us back: memories, fears, rejection, or other such things. What binds you? What keeps you from fully being your own most true self in Christ?

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Teens:

Lazarus received a second chance at life through Jesus. How have you experienced second chances in your own life?

Children:

How do your actions show that you put your faith and trust in Jesus?

Leisure Club Update



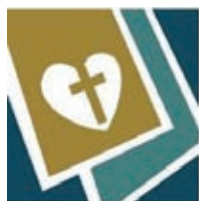

Introductory Statements before Sunday, March 22nd's Mass by Fr. Tom Newton



FROM THE PASTOR

First of all, my prayers and the prayers of our entire community go out to all who are suffering at this time. The sick, the dying, those who have died and their families. It is God alone that can bring peace and healing.

Yesterday, Governor Murphy signed an executive order which places further restrictions on residents of New Jersey. These restrictions as well as a memo to Pastors from Bishop Sullivan have an impact on Christ Our Light and the other parishes of the Camden Diocese.

Only the resident clergy and those who live in the rectory may be present for the daily celebration of Mass with the exception of one technician who can film or livestream the Mass.

The Parish and School offices are closed. And no parish or school activities will be held. Parish and School staff will all continue to work from home. I have asked them to check their phone and voice mail messages on a regular basis and respond to all in a timely manner.

Mrs. Webb has done a fantastic job of communicating with the staff and parents of the students in our school to set up remote and on line learning and will continue to do so. We can learn a lot from her.

All Funeral, weddings, baptisms and other gatherings are now prohibited by the Governor's order and by Bishop Sullivan's directives.

Regarding funerals, please know that a public memorial Mass can be scheduled for a later date. However, should parishioners need to bury a loved one immediately, arrangements can be made through the funeral director. A priest will come to the cemetery to celebrate the burial rites. The priest will also celebrate a private Mass without a congregation on the day of the burial for the deceased person.

Regarding weddings, please contact the priest planning to celebrate your wedding to discuss specifics.

A decision regarding the celebration of liturgies for the Sacred Triduum and Easter will be made at a later date.

All other parish and school related activities are cancelled until further notice.

Organizations like Christ Our Light and other charities and nonprofits are on the frontline responding to our neighbors and communities in need during this crisis. We also want to continue to pay our employees for as long as we possibly can. However, we are risking catastrophic damage from evaporating revenue, new and rising demands for assistance and major disruptions in charitable giving. If you can, please continue to be faithful to your weekly church offering by either sending it in the mail or signing up on our website for on-line giving.

In closing, I believe in two important truths:

1. We can learn something very powerful about God, about ourselves and about what it truly means to be a follower of Christ more honestly in difficult times as opposed to easy times.
2. Everyone working together, being kind to one another, caring for those most in need, loving and forgiving each other, can call upon God to lead us out of the darkness and into the light.

Casseroles for Joseph's House



MARK YOU CALENDARS! Our next scheduled delivery of casseroles for Joseph's House will be Monday, April 13, 2020. Currently, since there are no regularly scheduled

Masses due to the COVID-19 outbreak, our collection process will be slightly different. The church remains open from 6:00 am to 6:00 pm daily. You can put casseroles directly in the freezer in the Servers Room, which is the first door to the right as you enter the Ministry Center. Other donations of staples, toiletries, etc., may be placed on the cart in the Servers Room. Joseph's House continues to remain open to serve the needs of our homeless brothers and sister during this health crisis, while complying with the regulations as prescribed by the CDC and other regulatory agencies. In March, we delivered 28 casseroles, snacks, breads, sugar, coffee, creamer, soups and a blanket. Thank you so much for your generosity. During this critical time, your support is vital and greatly appreciated!

Since adding a day program, Joseph's House welcomes both breakfast and dinner casseroles. When your casserole is cooled, cover securely, label with the main ingredients and the date prepared and, if possible, freeze your meal. **Store bought casseroles are also most welcome.** Casserole pans and lids are available in the lower left cabinet behind the Welcome Desk along the church wall. Please use them, if you can.

Cherry Hill Food Pantry - Mall Walk

Reflection by Chris Becker

In the Desert

So here we are, once again in the Lenten season, called by the Spirit out into the desert for a time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, and this time this time it feels different.

Coronavirus. Social Distancing. Worry a sense of separation. What does it look like as we try to live out faith in this particular sort of desert, when the routines and the rhythms of life are disrupted, when church activities and even public masses are canceled? We know that God can speak to us through the difficult and the isolating, so in these days what do we find He is saying to us? What are the ways that He is calling us to live out the Lenten practices, and what lessons do we take with us beyond this time? The three thoughts below are intended to prompt conversation, and hopefully in the weeks to come we can add to these with other ideas.

Empathy and Solidarity

As we experience separation from each other, we've been given a precious opportunity to remember those in our community for whom this is the norm of life. The elderly and the home-bound often live each day cut off from others, with hearts aching to be seen and loved. God sent them into the world with words to speak and gifts to share Do we see and hear them? Listen to what they have to say, because they've lived in this reality far longer than we have Can they be our teachers in this moment? And as many of us face economic challenges of reduced or lost work, can we likewise find greater solidarity with the poor? Can we allow the desert to deepen our sense of communal responsibility for one another, and to strengthen our compassion?

Routine, Rhythm, and Prayer

We live a sacramental faith, one rooted in place and time, where the spiritual and physical encounter one another in shared meals and songs and gatherings, and changes to the rhythm of those practices can leave us feeling adrift. Perhaps in these weeks we can grow closer to God through the other rhythms of our days, those of rising, eating, praying, working, resting, caring, conversing, and sleeping Can we find and set aside some time each day to pray? Can we offer to God our smallest and most ordinary actions as gifts of love? For those of us whose lives are usually more hectic, maybe this can be a time of recollection and of meeting Jesus in solitude and the quiet (or the noise if you have small children at home!) While public masses have broadly been canceled, many parishes have started streaming the mass online, and in this time when we can't physically receive Christ in the Eucharist, we can remember to make prayers of spiritual communion.

Connection and Sharing

Social distancing has removed many of the usual ways that we connect with each other. Our faith is one of community, of giving and receiving, and this time may be offering us a chance to create new bonds with each other through unexpected channels. Can we share time together through virtual means such as Skype, Zoom, or Facetime? For those who live alone, perhaps we can share a meal with someone over an open video call, or watch a movie and talk about it afterwards. Are there ways we haven't thought of to volunteer our time or resources to help, even at a distance?

Hopefully we can have further and fuller conversations in the days and weeks to come about how to live as the Body of Christ in this present circumstance, and how to nurture a deeper sense of Hope. What might we learn from each other here in the desert during this Lent, on the long road to Holy Week and the Cross? What is God calling us to this year, and where will He take us next?
