- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

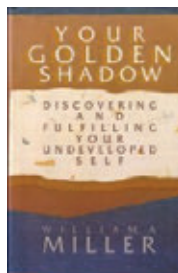

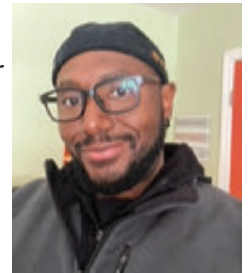

Black History Month

Venerable Augustus Tolton

The Unity Rich in Diversity Focus Group this week introduces Venerable Augustus Tolton. Like Venerable Henriette Delile, Fr. Tolton is in the second phase of the canonization process. His story reflects the tumult of the last half of the 19th century in America as the country struggled through racial injustice in the period of Reconstruction after the Civil War.

Augustus Tolton was the second of three children born to slaves, Peter Paul Tolton and his wife Martha Jane, on April 1, 1854, in Brush Creek, Missouri. Both Peter Paul and Martha Jane, owned by Catholic slaveowners, had been baptized in the Catholic Church. With the outbreak of the Civil War, Peter Paul escaped to St. Louis and joined the Union Army, hoping to gain freedom for his family, only to die of dysentery shortly after in an Arkansas military dispensary. His widow, continuing his quest for freedom, fled north with her children, crossing the Mississippi River, and making her way safely to the small town of Quincy, Illinois, a first stop on the Underground Railroad. Augustus and his siblings were enrolled at St. Boniface Catholic School. Here they were taunted and tormented with racial slurs and insults. Parents threatened to withdraw their children and withhold financial support from the parish. After a month, Mrs. Tolton withdrew the children.



Augustus found work in a tobacco factory to help support the family. Eventually, a small group of dedicated nuns and priests taught him to read and write in both English and German. One of these priests, Fr. Peter McGirr, pastor of what would become St. Peter's parish, recognizing Augustus' abilities, defied parishioners' objections and enrolled him in his parish school. At the age of sixteen, on the day of his First Communion, Augustus said he envisioned himself becoming a priest. Recognizing Augustus' "genuine faith and integrity", Fr. McGirr and later, Fr. Francis Reinhart, encouraged and assisted in his education and pursuit of his vocation. After years of rejection from seminaries in the US, finally, in 1880, at the age of 25, he was accepted at the Urbanum Collegium de Propaganda Fide in Rome where he was welcomed unconditionally. On April 24, 1886 he was ordained as the first black American priest.

Returning to the US, Fr. Augustus' first assignment was St. Joseph's church in his home town of Quincy. He received enormous respect from the community. Masses were filled to capacity. Nevertheless, dire poverty and discrimination from other clergy thwarted his efforts. After three years, Fr. Tolton requested and obtained permission to transfer to the Archdiocese of Chicago where he was made pastor of St. Augustine's Church with pastoral jurisdiction over all black Catholics in Chicago. Here he would serve out the remaining years of his ministry. From the basement of St. Mary's church to a storefront church called St. Monica's, Fr. Tolton and his parishioners dreamed of building a handsome church for black Catholics. While land was purchased, sufficient funds were never raised to complete construction. Meanwhile, Fr. Tolton ministered tirelessly to the spiritual and material needs of his congregation. Fatigue and exhaustion were constant companions. On July 9, 1897, at the age of 43, Fr. Augustus Tolton collapsed and died of heat stroke and uremia. He had given his all to God and his people.

In 2019, Pope Francis advanced the cause of canonization of Fr. Augustus Tolton, begun in 2010, elevating him to the title of Venerable Fr. Augustus Tolton.

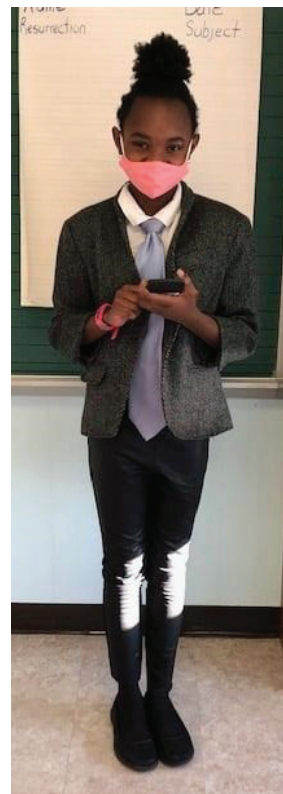

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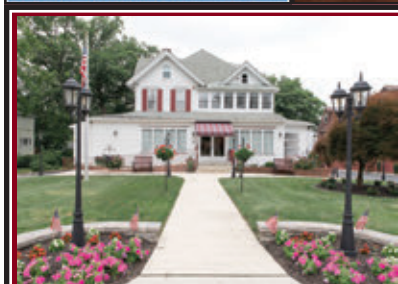
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
