COME and SEE



In today's Gospel we see elements of the formation of the two disciples in true Missionary Discipleship on their journey to a life-changing encounter with the risen Christ.

Jesus says "touch me and see", not just any INVITATION but a very intimate invitation to touch his hands and feet, and to believe.

Jesus came to the two while they were "on the way", that is, they were on a journey and Jesus chose to ACCOMPANY them and to break bread with them.

Jesus continues to provide COMMUNITY and ENCOURAGEMENT as he "opened their minds to understand the Scriptures".

Finally, He SENDS them forth telling them that the Good News of death and resurrection and repentance would be "preached in his name to all the nations".

These are four clear steps as often outlined by Pope Francis in his exhortations to new evangelization, and they should be present in each of our journeys as Missionary Disciples.

Invite - Accompany - Encourage - Send

Let us go forth this Easter to intentionally invite someone to join us here at Christ Our Light, to come and see, and then to accompany them as they enter into our community to hopefully have a personal encounter with Christ so that they too might be "incredulous with joy" and ultimately sent forth to preach the Good News.

The Word

Reading for April 14, 2024

Luke 24: 35-48

Adults:

When have you had an “Aha”; moment, when you suddenly realized that God was with you?

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God’s word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God’s word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God’s presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God’s presence and be still, surrounded by God’s love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God’s nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Youth:

What are some ways that you know that God is with you? Who are the people, where are the place, and what are the occasions when you feel closest to God?

Children:

Name some times when you know Jesus is with you.

Parish Nursing



Alcohol-related problems continue to take a heavy toll on individuals, families, and communities. Researchers estimate that each year there are more than 178,000 alcohol-related deaths, making alcohol a leading preventable cause of death in the United States.

Unfortunately the stigma that still surrounds alcohol use may prevent people from getting the help they need. Stigma can cause people to downplay how often they drink, how much they drink, and the impact drinking has on their life.

Identify your drinking habits Excessive alcohol use includes binge drinking and heavy drinking.

- Binge drinking = 5+ drinks for men and 4+ drinks for women within a 2-hour period.
- Heavy drinking = 14+ drinks for men and 7+ drinks for women within a week.

Understand the dangers of alcohol Excessive alcohol use increases a person's risk of stroke, liver cirrhosis, alcoholic hepatitis, cancer, and other serious health conditions. It leads to risk-taking behavior, such as driving while impaired. Alcohol also increases the risk of death from car crashes, injuries, homicide, and suicide.

If you think you may have a problem It is important to overcome stigma, be honest about your drinking habits, and seek support from a health care provider.

Christ is Risen! He is Alive!

A festival of the light of Christ is a way of celebrating the resurrection which, for each person, already begins invisibly here on earth. Upon entering the church, which should be dimly lit, everyone receives a small candle. While a song of resurrection is sung, each person's candle is lit, until the whole church is full of light. This is a sign of the light of Christ, which also symbolizes our identity as Christians as children of the light. Then one of the Gospel accounts of the resurrection can be read, followed by more joyful meditative singing.

Taizé Community is a monastic order in Taizé, in Burgundy, France. Prayer together, three times a day, is at the heart of life in Taizé. This is a quite simple style of prayer which includes a few songs, a psalm, a Bible reading, a time of silence, and then intercessions. Short songs (chants), sung again and again, give it a meditative character. The words and phrases used in these chants are taken from the Holy Bible or writings of saints. Meditative singing thus becomes a way of listening to God. It allows everyone to take part in a time of prayer together and to remain together in attentive waiting on God.

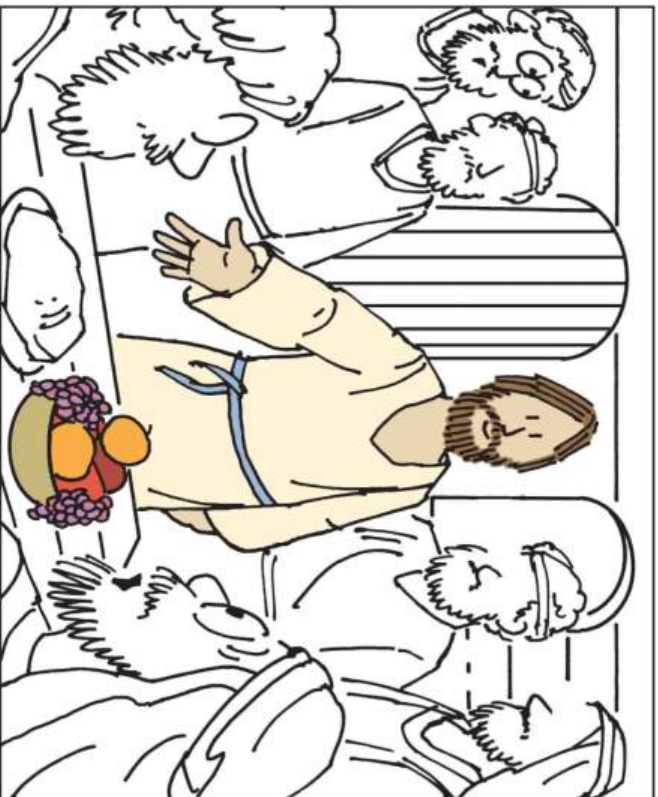

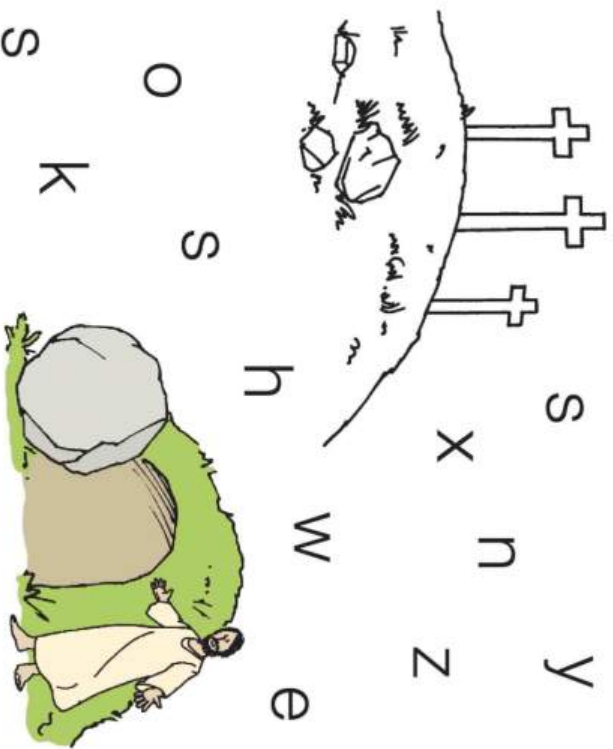
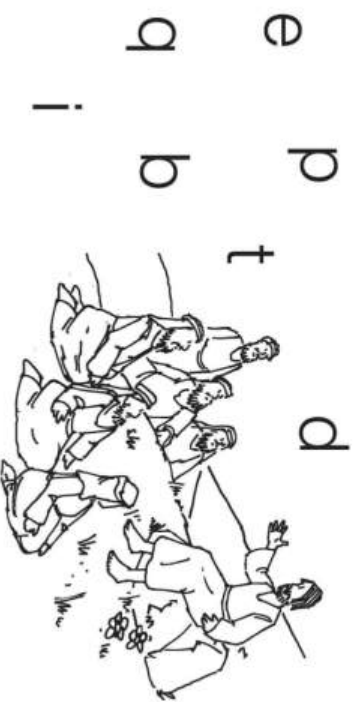
