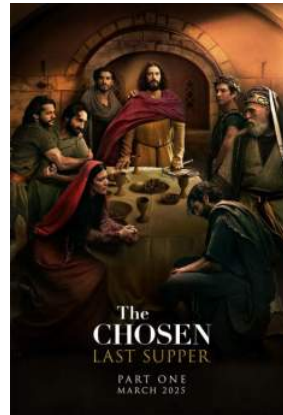

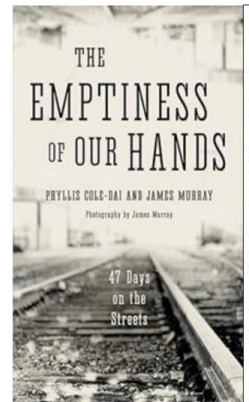
The Emptiness of our Hands: 47 Days on the Streets

We were delighted to have over 70 people sign up for our kick off event with the author, Phyllis Cole-Dai last week. She was inspiring and shared the impetus for her 47 days on the streets with the homeless in Columbus, OH: *"I was trying to get at something utterly heart breaking..."* Phyllis depicted how she aimed to be present to every person she met. We too are challenged and called to be present by keeping our minds, thoughts, and heart where we physically are. This practice enabled her to see and know the sacred in others; Jesus invites each of us to do as He did.

Two big 'takeaways' were: 1) *Don't let what we can't do prevent us from doing what we can;* 2) *As we enter into our own pain or another's, it is easier when we are not alone in our trying.*

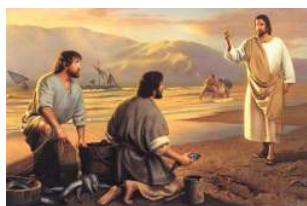
As you enter Lent, you are invited to read the daily entries in the book to 'come and see' as you discover the sacred in yourself and others.

"Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not, you can cut it down." Luke 13:1-9

Jesus' short parable about a fig tree speaks about Judgment Day and our need to be ready for it. The parable warns us that if we have not yet repented, then we need to look to Jesus to acknowledge our shortcomings and make permanent changes in our faith.

In this parable, God is the vineyard owner who wants to cut down the tree because it is not bearing fruit. Jesus is the gardener who is asking God for more time to show us the path to bearing fruit by in deepening our faith and love. The tree represents all people who need to repent.

With Jesus' assistance, we have to time to make changes to grow and mature in our faith.

But how long do we have to become more disciple-like by living our faith? God is patient but at some unknown point in time, Judgment Day will arrive. After having a chance to repent, will we be prepared?

Jesus is trying to help us but there is an urgency to His call to discipleship.

To enter eternal life, we must accept Jesus' invitation to Come and See by repenting (bearing fruit) before time runs out.

A Story of Hope From Guatemala

"I don't want to see my children suffering from hunger. Thank God this project came along." – Ana Belén

Nutritious Meals Help Children's Growth.

Ana Belén and her husband, José, have four children and a baby on the way. They live in a small house in Santa María Chiquimula, Guatemala. Francisco, their 9-year-old son, says his neighborhood is, "a very happy place to live, but sometimes it's also very hard to live here." He is not wrong. In their community, malnutrition affects over half of the population mainly because people can't afford to put food on the table.

Almost five years ago, when the COVID-19 pandemic started, José lost his job as a driver. This created serious challenges for the family. Even after the pandemic, things never went back to normal. Food prices went up and eggs became twice as expensive. Bad weather made things worse—strong rains damaged the crops, causing the prices of vegetables, including tomatoes, onions and corn to go up.

When Ana Belén went to the market, she could barely buy anything. The little money she had wasn't enough to buy even the basics. "Sometimes I would cry because I didn't have anything to give my children," she recalls. Now the family participates in a Catholic Relief Services project that helps fight hunger in places where people don't have enough food. Through the project, Ana Belén goes every other week to her children's school to receive food such as corn, beans, rice, vegetable oil and eggs. "It made me happy when they started giving me eggs," she says.

Her children really like eggs, especially hard-boiled with beans, so they make sure to remind their mom when it's time to pick them up. Ana Belén's family now eats nutritious meals every day. She also makes sure to take her children for monthly health check-ups, as part of the project.

Having enough nutritious food is very important to help children grow healthy and gives them the energy they need to learn and play, just like Francisco, who loves playing ball with his cousins and at school. *This Lent, try black bean soup, a meatless dish commonly eaten in Guatemala. For people living in developing countries around the world, lack of access to traditional financial services keeps them from providing for their material needs. A Catholic Relief Services (CRS) program has created Savings and Internal Lending Communities (SILCs) to address this lack by helping poor communities to pool savings, which then can be lent to SILC members to build or grow businesses at low cost. In Chad, Claudine, a mother of six, uses loans from her local SILC to buy large, lower-cost quantities of the ingredients she needs to make the beignets she sells at market. Before the SILC was established, Claudine was barely able to sell enough beignets to live. But now these cost savings allow her to care for her family and pay school fees.
