The Word

Reading for May 4, 2025

John 21: 1-19

Adults:

When has your belief in the Risen Jesus helped redirect you to something that provided abundance?

We offer this form of *Lectio Divina* (sacred reading) for pondering Scripture and for faith sharing with family members and other people.

- Listen/ Read (*Lectio*): Ponder God's word and listen for what touches your heart.
- Meditate (*Meditatio*): Attend to what you notice. Allow God's word to resonate in you.
- Speak/Share (*Oratio*): Prayerfully share with Jesus or with the group your thoughts and feelings.
- Rest in God's presence (*Contemplatio*): Notice God's presence and be still, surrounded by God's love.
- Choose to act (*Actio*): Trusting in God's nearness, commit to action rooted in love.

Children:

How does Jesus know that you love him?

Chair Yoga

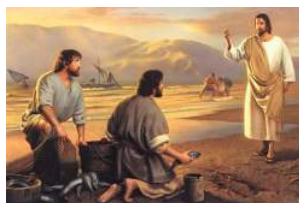


This practice links the movement of the breath with gentler yoga postures. De-stress while you stretch, strengthen, and breathe from the comfort of your chair.

Come and See



Do you love me?

Love is a complicated word. We use it in all sorts of ways. I love music. I love ice cream. I love you. One word - a variety of meanings. New Testament Greek has specific words for distinct types of love and they are being used in our Gospel...but we have only one word in English and so we miss the differences.

In our Gospel, Peter decides to go fishing. In a sense, he is returning to his former way of life. Perhaps the guilt and shame of denying Jesus as well as the uncertainty of the future were overwhelming. But Jesus has plans. When Peter comes back to shore, he sees Jesus by a charcoal fire. This is significant because Peter publicly denied Jesus by a charcoal fire. Jesus prepared breakfast and shares a meal with His disciples. After the meal, Jesus publicly asks Peter three times if Peter loves Him. Jesus offers forgiveness and restoration to Peter for all to witness. Yet there is more to this encounter...

Jesus first asks if Peter has Agape - unconditional love and Peter responds that he has Philia or friendship love. Jesus repeats the question (Agape) and receives the same response (Philia). The third time, Jesus asks Peter if he has Philia love and Peter affirms this. Notice what Jesus is doing. Peter is called to Agape love but Peter is not there. So Jesus accepts Peter where he is at (Philia) with the goal of moving him to Agape. And Peter will get there. Jesus foretells that Peter will one day be arrested and offer up his life for Jesus...Agape. How does Peter get there? Through a life long relationship with Jesus that transforms him and deepens his discipleship.

Come and See! We too are called to love unconditionally (Agape). We may be a work in progress but Jesus is willing to meet us where we are and journey with us towards Agape. We cannot do this by ourselves. We need Jesus. The closing words of Jesus to Peter reveal the way to Agape - "Follow me."

May we follow when Jesus asks us...

Do you love me?

"Santacruzán", Spanish for "Holy Cross", honors the finding of the True Cross of Jesus by St. Helena. Early in the 4th century, St. Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, went to Jerusalem in search of the True Cross. During the excavation, workers found 3 crosses. Legend has it that the one on which Jesus died was identified when its touch healed a dying person. Santacruzán is also celebrated in the month of May to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Santacruzán is a grand procession that commemorates Queen Helena's journey. It features a parade of elegantly dressed participants representing various biblical and historical figures, each symbolizing virtues such as faith, hope and charity.

The celebration will begin with the Holy Rosary at 12:30 PM and the Holy Mass at 1:00 PM. A procession will follow and then fellowship at the Parish Center gym.

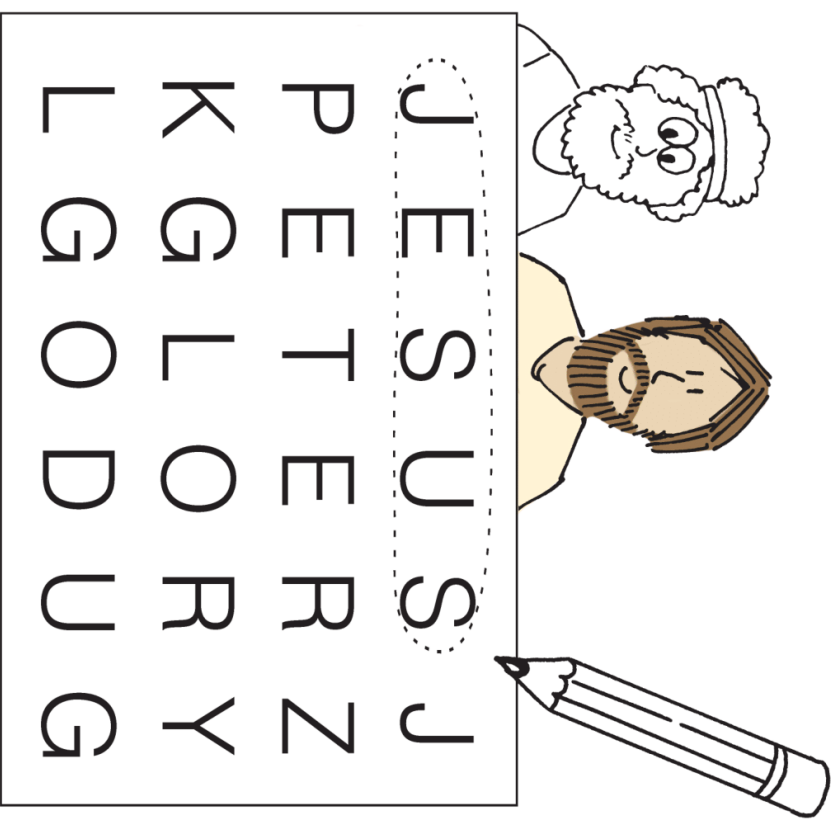

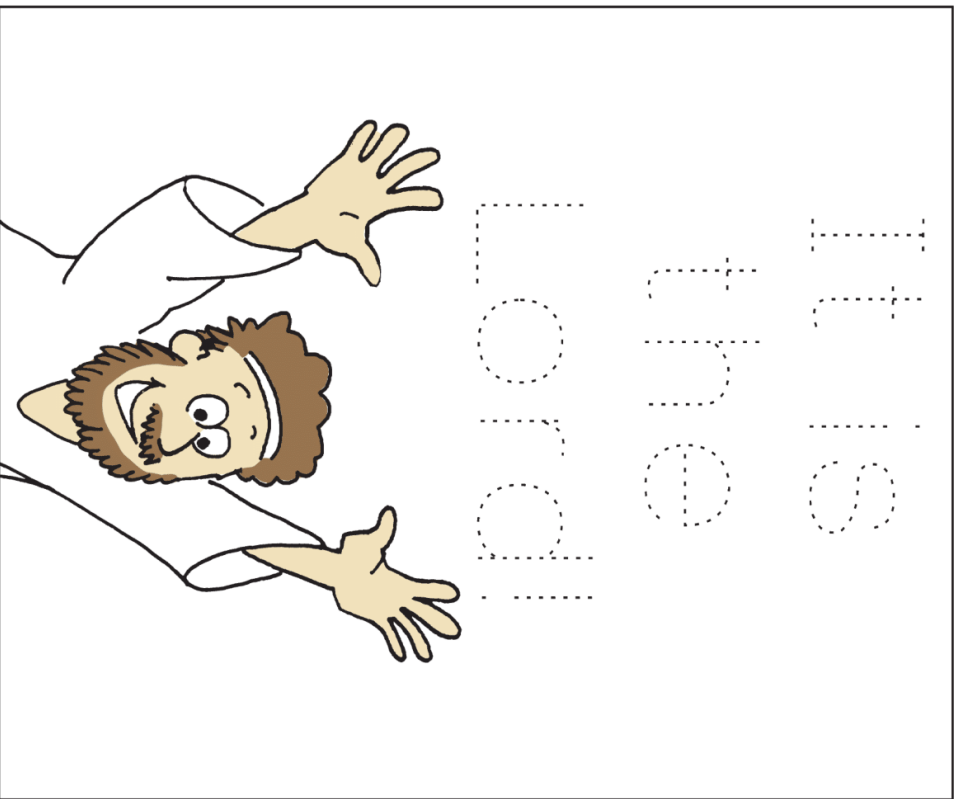

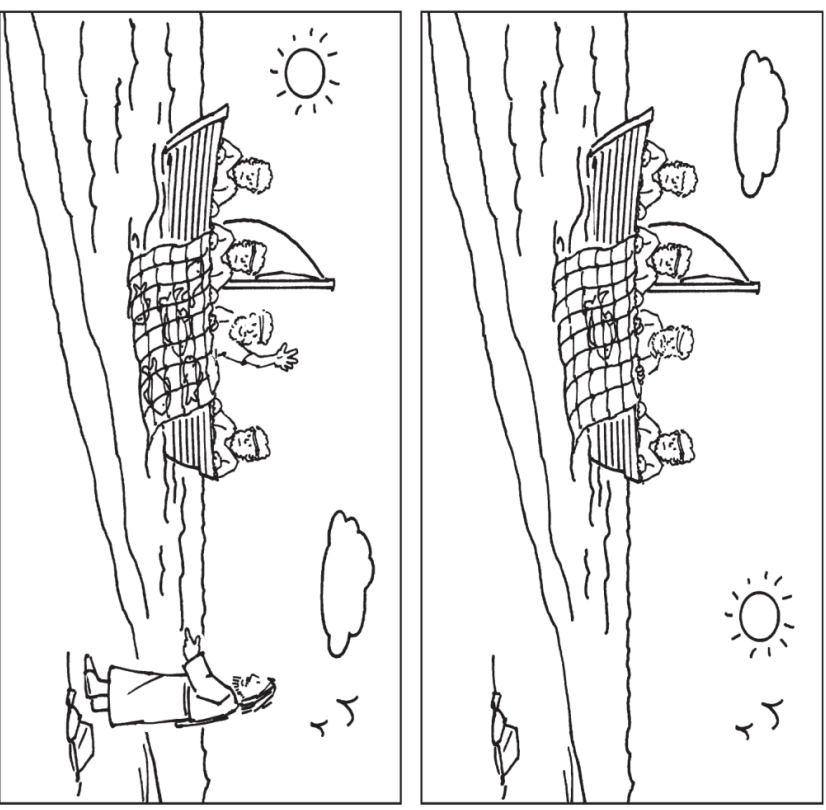
